

Princess Cruises and Cruise Critic have teamed up to sponsor Meet and Greets. Several Princess officers will take the time to meet with a group of Cruise Critic members, providing refreshments and pastries, in addition to lots of fascinating information. You will also have the opportunity to provide feedback and ask questions. For details, check out the Roll Call forums on Cruise Critic (see *Appendix-Resources*).

You may board with one bottle of wine per passenger (although quantity is rarely enforced) for consumption in your stateroom. A corkage fee of \$15 will apply if you decide to consume it in the dining room.

On board Caribbean Princess and Gem Class II ships, there is a little known public space above the bridge. This can be accessed via Lido deck forward, but be careful, it can be dangerous on a windy day.

***Secret Cabins*** - Because most Princess ships are built off of the same basic Grand Class design, you will find the same types of “secret cabins” on board most ships. Subtle differences exist, so review the information carefully.

Sun Class ships offer a few “secret cabins”, which are limited to the largest suites. Mini-suite C744 and C747 are the largest of all mini-suites on board. Category AA suites, D750 and D753, offer the most interior space (and a covered balcony), while C746 and C749 offer the largest balcony.

***On Sun Class ships, rectangular shaped inside cabins are the largest inside cabins, while Category F oceanview cabins on Plaza deck are the largest standard oceanview cabins.***

On Grand Class ships, Mini-Suites E728, E729, D732, and D733 offer wide balconies that extend beyond the width of the cabin. The two Dolphin Deck cabins, however, have immovable beds, no bathtub and a wholly uncovered balcony. Balcony cabins E730, E731, D734, and D735 are located at the aft of the ship and provide large, deep balconies. Balcony cabins C742, C743, B744, B745, L311 and L312 (L256/L259 on Grand) offer angled balconies, which provide slightly more space than other balcony cabins. Inside cabins C106, A507, A508, A514, and A515 (A516/A517 on Grand) offer a square layout with slightly more square footage than other standard cabins. Vista Suites on Dolphin Deck offer larger balconies, but a smaller cabin than Vista Suites on Emerald Deck.
